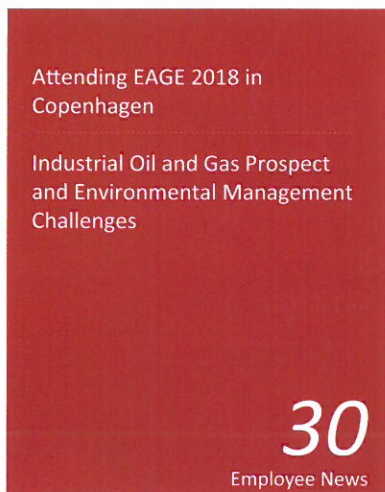

ITB Wants to Move Closer to Industry Sector

Bandung Institute of Technology (ITB) has set a new direction to move closer to industry sector. Having an internship cooperation with PetroChina is one of many ways to get there. ITB Rector Professor Kadarsyah Suryadi talked to Lampion's Ms. Lutfi Rakhmawati to tell how the industry sector could help creating qualified graduates

Q: As one of the most reputable universities in Indonesia, how ITB educates its students?

A: We are education institution. Undoubtedly, our job is to prepare the students so they could give their best contribution to the society. We educate the students to adopt to the social dynamics and also to innovate.

In 2015, we introduced ITB's new direction to move closer to industry sector. We expand our focus from research university to entrepreneurship university. It means that we not only seek excellency in teaching and researching, but also in innovation. We believe that technology and social dynamics change very fast. That's why we have to change the way we educate the students. It is not enough to introduce many theories in the classroom or laboratory. Students must be exposed with real-life experiences outside the campus.

Q: Speaking of change, are petroleum-related majors still

become the favorite choices for highschool graduates, especially since the fall of oil prices in the last few years?

A: Actually no. The enthusiasm remains high. The Mining and Petroleum Engineering is still one of three favorites faculties other than Electrical Engineering and Industrial Engineering. We are not worried about the talented students who want to continue their education in these majors.

However, we realize that the industry has slowed down in the last few years. The job opportunities decreased and many oil and gas companies halted their education programs due to cost efficiency. This situation convinced us that universities really had to change the way they prepare the students for real-life situation.

Q: How do you do it?

A: By becoming the bridge between the students and the industry sector. Connectivity is the key, and we believe both the industry and the university could reap good results from mutual partnership. The oil and gas firms face real challenges on daily basis, because they run the business. The academic community have the theories and enough research capacity but sometimes don't know what's really going on in the industry.

Let's take the research pattern as the example. In conventional way, the research is developed inside the campus and we bring them to the industry to check whether the result

is relevant. We want to change this. Research topic must come from real problems found in the field, and we brought the idea back to campus to find the solution. That's how we want to do it. Therefore, we are very glad to have the partnership program with PetroChina.

Q: What do you expect from our newly-signed cooperation?

A: First, we want our fresh graduates to face real situation in field. It is the best way for them to learn. The PetroChina Internship Program (PIP) that we just signed would involve our graduates and some of their lecturers in PetroChina's operation. The partnership enables us to develop various experiments that are necessary to develop oil and gas industry in Indonesia, such as Enhanced Oil Recovery and Carbon Captured Storage technology. During the period of internship, there will be monitoring and evaluation, so we could learn how effective the theories are applied in the real job.

Q: Do you have other long-term goal from this partnership?

A: As I said, connectivity is the key. While we believe the partnership with PetroChina Indonesia will give us many benefits, we hope to broaden the academic cooperation with CNPC or other education institutions in China. CNPC and its research center RIPED has earned the admirable reputation as the center of knowledge and latest technology. We do hope that one day, we will be able to learn from them.

Interview with Tanjung Jabung Timur Regent Mr. Romi Hariyanto



Infrastructure Projects still Vital for Tanjung Jabung Timur People

Social investment programs, which is PetroChina's contribution to local people around our working area, cover many sectors, from education to health and infrastructure. Recently, we have focused more on economic empowerment, but Tanjung Jabung Timur Regent Mr. Romi Haryanto still sees infrastructure as what his people badly need. He shares some of his ideas to Communication Manager Mr. Ginandja

Q: PetroChina has been operating for more than 16 years in Tanjung Jabung Timur, how it contributes to the development of the area?

A: PetroChina has contributed a lot for our people, helping the government to provide roads, electricity network, school buildings, health facilities, and other projects. Having said that, I believe that there are more things you can do to improve the welfare of people in Tanjung Jabung Timur.

Q: What kind of programs?

A: In terms of economic empowerment, I hope that PetroChina could assist our local business community to reach their best potential. We also have liberica coffee farmers in our area, but most of them are not trained well enough to produce qualified coffee beans. We have sufficient amount of land and are confident to develop the coffee

industry. But we will need the full support from PetroChina.

We also have the local batik business, that gives distinctive pattern of Tanjung Jabung Timur. We have the batik makers, but still find difficulties to introduce them to wider market. What if PetroChina helps us promoting it? Maybe you can start it by regularly using Tanjung Jabung Timur batik as your uniform. You can also create souvenirs from the batik.

Q: What are the focus of your development programs?

A: Honestly, we still need many infrastructure projects. Therefore, I am disappointed to learn that PetroChina will shift to empowerment projects rather than infrastructure. We are still a new regency. There are many public facilities that we must construct. Empowerment programs surely will be beneficial for many of our people, but infrastructure assistance also very important. Just think about roads and how better connectivity will change people's lives. The necessary infrastructures will elevate their welfare.

Q: What about our contribution in Tanjung Jabung Timur's revenue?

A: Most of our regional budget comes from the central government. The total of our budget is less than 1 trillion rupiah. The contribution from oil and gas sector, especially from PetroChina, is less than 20 percent. We receive less now as the oil price is decreasing. The prices are getting better now, but we have yet to enjoy the result.

Maybe next year. We hope that the oil prices will get better. We used to receive around Rp 300 million from oil and gas industry.

Q: What do you expect from us?

A: Help the government to build our regency. As of today, many parts of our regency is still categorized as underdeveloped area. We promise that the government will fully support PetroChina's operation in Tanjung Jabung Timur, as long as you pay attention to our people. We really appreciate if PetroChina could increase the social investment budget to make your contribution even more significant. Please build, educate and train the people to be fully independent and empowered community.

Last year, PetroChina Jabung already secured the Green Proper. It means that this company has performed well in safe operation, environmental preservation and social programs. Green is good, but Gold Proper is better. I believe there are more that the company could do for the sake of the local community.

As you're also approaching the contract expiration for Jabung Block in 2023, the government will support the extension period, as long as we can see the positive impact of your operation here.

PetroChina Vows to Improve Employees' Benefits

Employees are a company's greatest asset" is something we often heard, and something we try best to realize. Over the past few years, despite our late start, PetroChina has tried to level up the benefits for all workers. While global oil price was not in our favor, we managed to get 8 percent salary rise for some employees in late 2017.



Throughout 2018, we will gradually increase the salary of our employees through Special Market Adjustment (SMA) of 12.05 percent, the merit increase of nine percent, and the promotion of one percent. The HR Department has already secured the budget this year. As we know, the special adjustment was necessary for PetroChina employees to reach the average salary market.

Even with more than 20 percent salary rise in 2018, we have yet to achieve the average salary market. Therefore, the management of PetroChina aims to provide 16 percent of salary rise for 2019, which comprises of eight percent of SMA and salary scale, seven percent of merit increase and one percent of promotion. We also expect to provide the double-salary production incentives.

The 16 percent target in 2019 will bring us closer to the market standard. However, as much as we want to get it done immediately, we still have many works to do. The most important thing is ensuring that PetroChina achieved the production target set by the Government of Indonesia. On the same time, the company must perform cost-effective and cost-efficient operation, which will lead us to lower cost-recovery funds and higher Indonesian government revenue.

The PetroChina management has decided to cut the operation costs in most departments. We, however, are committed to keep the budgets related to employee benefits, CSR projects, as well as health, safety, security and environment. Those are three very important aspects for the company, and we will prioritize them over other efficiency efforts.

If we managed to achieve the production target and record good performance in safe working hours, we are confident that PetroChina employees would enjoy better salary next year. For that purpose, I humbly ask for your commitment and dedication to improve the company's performance.

As the management of PetroChina, it is our target to always increase the benefit for the employees. We will work hard, and hope you will work with us.

PetroChina Seals Internship Agreement with Top Universities

PetroChina International Jabung Ltd. has recently signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) on project-based internship programs with Bandung Institute of Technology (ITB) in Bandung and Trisakti University in Jakarta.

Another MoU signing ceremony with Gadjah Mada University (UGM) on similar program is soon scheduled.

The MoU signing ceremony with ITB took place on Wednesday, July 11, 2018 in ITB's Rectorat Office in Bandung. PetroChina President Mr. Gong Bencai signed the agreement along with ITB Rector Mr. Kadarsyah Suryadi.

According to the agreement, fresh graduates from bachelor and master degrees are welcomed to join oil and gas-related projects in PetroChina's Jakarta office or Jabung Field in Jambi. The candidates of the internship program will undergo several tests that involved PetroChina's HRD and related departments.

"Apart from doing business in Indonesia, we also want to contribute to the improvement of education. We are proud of this initiative and hope that this small step is the beginning of more significant contribution in education," said Gong after the signing ceremony.

In this occasion, Gong was accompanied by VP HR and Services Mrs. Maryke Pulunggono and HR Manager Mr. Dencio Renato Boele.

On the sidelines of this signing ceremony, Gong also spent around 30 minutes to stroll around ITB Campus in downtown Bandung. Established in 1920, the university is regarded as one of best education institutions in Indonesia. While in the Faculty of Mining and Petroleum Engineering, Gong briefly joined a number of students who were having a class, visited some important laboratories, and met with some lecturers.

On the following day on July 12, 2018, PetroChina and Trisakti University's Faculty of Earth and Technology Industry signed the internship agreement in PetroChina's Jakarta Office.

The agreement paper was signed by both Gong and the Faculty's Dean Mr. Afiat Anugraha. Other PetroChina executives, including VP Finance and Control Mr. Xu Yalin, VP Business Mrs. Liu Hongna, VP Business Development and Technical Mr. Zhu Fumin, VP HR and Services Mrs. Maryke Pulunggono and VP SCM and Operation Supports Mr. Gusminar also attended the event.

Trisakti is regarded as the largest private university in Indonesia and has some important roles in the political reform in the country.

Prior to this agreement, PetroChina has opened many internship opportunities for university students or fresh graduates from various majors. The interns learn about real work challenges in different departments, including engineering, permit matters, HRD and Communication.

Developing Liberica Coffee Business in Tanjung Jabung Timur

The plan to develop liberica coffee in Tanjung Jabung Timur Regency will soon become real. It is marked with the visit to some locations of coffee development in Jember and Bondowoso, East Java, by the administration and PetroChina.

The visit was lead directly by Regent Romi Hariyanto, who brought his subordinates, and PetroChina's Communication Manager Ginandjar. PetroChina will later take a significant role to support and actively involved in the development of liberica coffee in the region.

The delegation firstly visited the Indonesian Coffee and Cocoa Research Institute (ICCR) in Jember on Monday, July 23. Here they received broad explanation about coffee and cocoa development from Director of ICCR Dr. Agung Wahyu Susilo, Chief of Coffee Research Center Dr. Sukrisno Widyotomo and Chief of ICCR Expert Council Dr. Pujiyanto.

They toured around the ICCR area and witnessed all stages of production of high quality coffee and cocoa. Started from the seeding process, nursery, cultivation, post-harvest, roasting, up to professional serving by barista. They also observed other products made from coffee and cocoa.

ICCR has become the referral center for coffee farmers, industry and coffee connoisseurs from Indonesia and abroad.

Sitting on around 160 hectares of land, ICCR is equipped with the latest research facility, as well as production facility for coffee and cocoa products. Furthermore, ICCR also produce supporting machineries for coffee and cocoa production.

According to Romi, he led this delegation because he wanted to be sure about what regulations to make in order to develop liberica coffee in his area. His initial plan was to develop coffee seed in five hectares of land in an integrated compound (Kota Terpadu Mandiri) in Geragai, and had another 10 hectares of land as the pilot project.

Director of ICCR, Dr. Agung Wahyu Susilo said that his organization would support Tanjung Jabung Timur's ambition to develop the liberica coffee. He would gladly visit the area, along with some other experts, in the near future.

According to technical direction of ICCR, the first step of coffee development is conducting a Baseline Study. It must be done to identify basic things on the spot, such as land, climate, social condition, seeding, cultivation, postharvest, institutional, marketing and yearly strategic plan that should be prepared to develop liberica coffee.

During the visit to ICCR, the entourage met with a group of farmers from Papua, who are doing an internship in the facility. They also went to the valley of Ijen Raung in Bondowoso, on the next day, to inspect coffee farm that has become the pride of Bondowoso people.

The farm lies on the area of PT Perhutani, which is actually a pines farm. There, the delegation witnessed coffee farm that



intercrop with pines farm, but neatly organized and professionally managed.

The coffee farm is managed by local farmers group. According to Sudjoko, Secretary of Agriculture Department of Bondowoso, last year's harvest reached 800 tons for 70,000 hectares of farm land. The large parts of it were sent to 45 home industries in Bondowoso. "Only about 20% of it went to export," he added. He explained that currently there are 14,000 hectares of farm land already have Geographic Indication.

Meanwhile, according to Hasan, Head of Farmers Group of Sukorejo Village, becoming coffee farmers has successfully lifted the wellbeing of his fellow villagers. Moreover, right now the demand for coffee is in the growing trend, domestically and internationally.

Tanjung Jabung Timur has a big potential for liberica coffee farming, eventhough the industry has not been properly developed.

Ginandjar said that PetroChina really supported the administration's intention to develop the coffee industry. "Not only is the coffee farming beneficial for the financial source, it also good for environment," he said. "Sustainable development goes in line with our PetroChina's values".

SKK Migas Chairman Visits Jabung Block for First Time

Chairman of Upstream oil regulator SKK Migas, Mr. Amien Sunaryadi, made a field visit to Jabung Block, operated by PetroChina International Jabung Ltd, on Tuesday, May 15, 2018. Amien became the first highest-level

official of the upstream oil regulator to visit Jabung, located in Jambi, since the block's production sharing contract was signed in 1993. Not only did Amien take a closer look of our operation in Betara Gas Plant (BGP) complex, he also visited the coffee house that built as part of PetroChina's social programs.

President of PetroChina International Companies in Indonesia Mr. Gong Bencai, Vice President HR and Relations Mrs. Maryke Pulunggono, Vice President Supply Chain Management and Operation Supports Mr. Gusminar, and Field Manager Jabung Mr. Arief Hari Suseno welcomed Amien and his entourage in Jabung Block.

Before reaching BGP, they stopped by Gerai UMKM, a coffee house and showroom to display locally-produced delicacies to enjoy Jambi's Liberica coffee. Supporting coffee farmers in the area has been PetroChina's main social investment programs. We assist the farmers from the early phase of growing the high quality coffee cherries to post-harvesting steps, up until preparing packaging and marketing strategies. Coffee farming is not only financially profitable but also good for environment.

During Amien's visit to Gerai UMKM, he also interacted with local students who received the book donation from PetroChina. Gong symbolically handed some science and story books for the students. Last year, PetroChina donated two mobile libraries to the administration of Tanjung Jabung Barat and Tanjung Jabung Timur. Each car was equipped with an array collection of books, a laptop with internet access, chairs and a tent. After spending about an hour in the Gerai, the entourage went to BGP Complex for a field visit to PetroChina facilities. The Jabung team also made a presentation about the block's updates and development for Amien and his team.

Jabung Block recorded first production in 1997 under the operatorship of Santa Fe Energy Resources. PetroChina has been operating the Jabung Block since 2002. The BGP was completed in 2005 and has the capacity to process 241 MMSCFD of raw gas with 38 percent to 40 percent of CO2 content. Currently, the production of Jabung Block has surpassed 60,000 BOEPD.

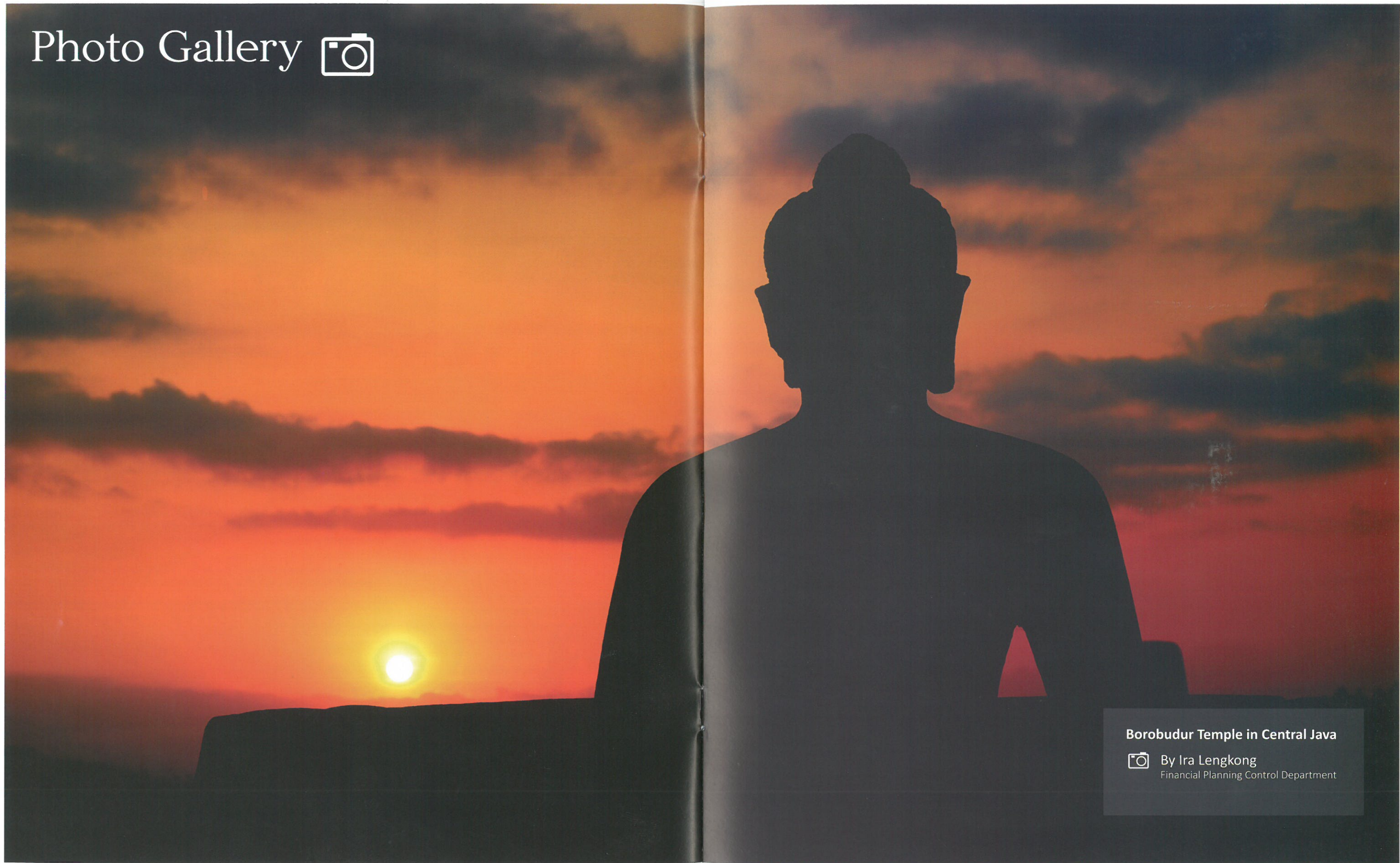
PetroChina management, including President Gong Bencai, General Manager Jabung Yu Guoyi, VP Business Development and Technical Zhu Fumin,

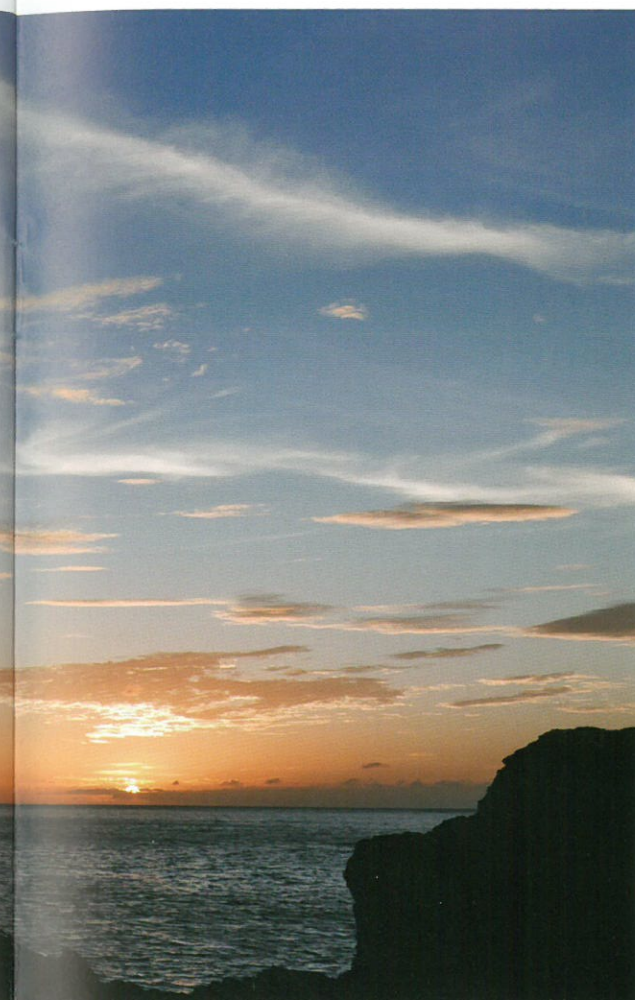

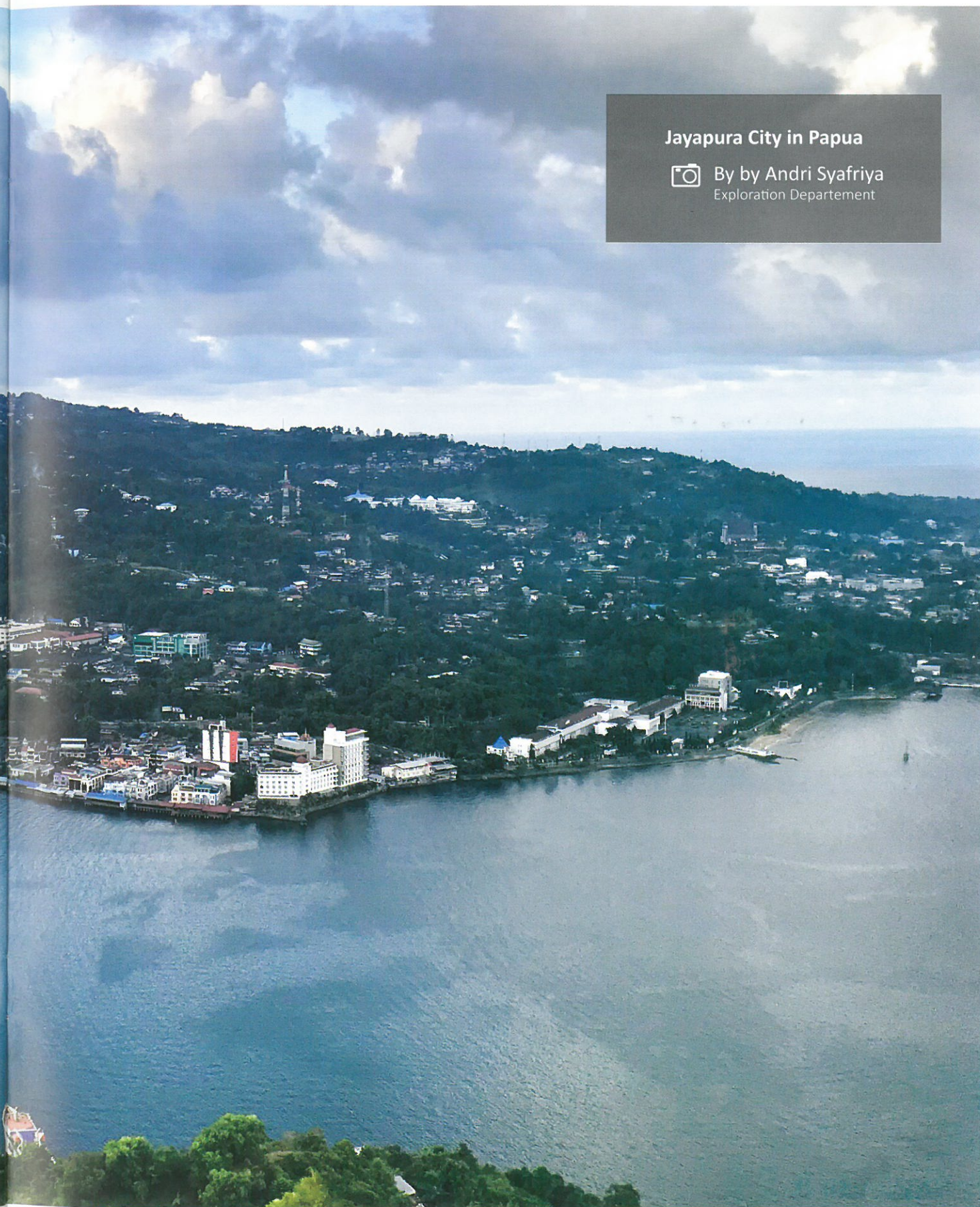
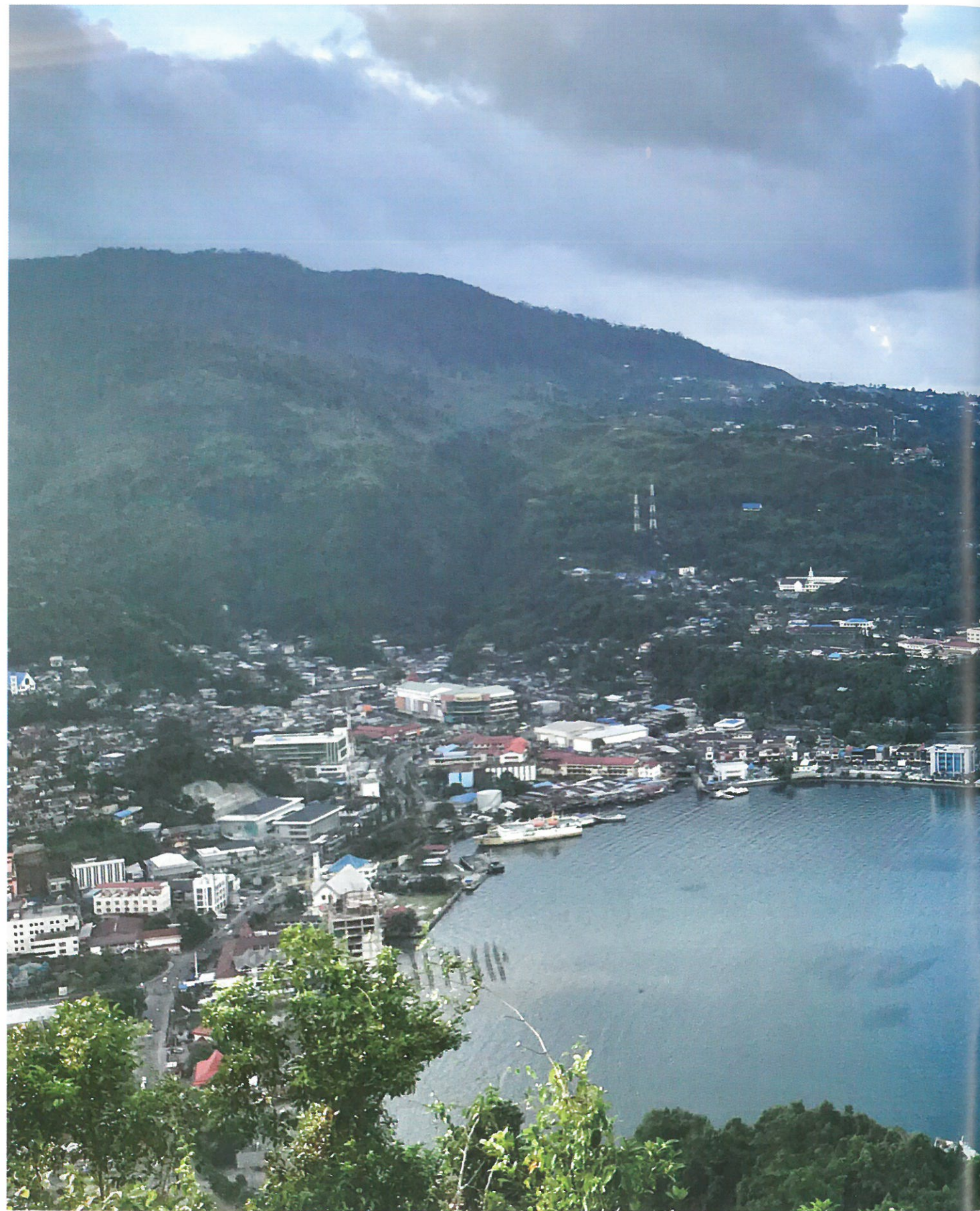

After publishing several papers to various international conferences, including the 2015 International Association of Petroleum Geologists (AAPG) 2015 in Melbourne Australia, International Petroleum Technology Conference (IPTC) 2016 in Bangkok Thailand, I am interested in writing other paper which related with my thesis during the Master Degree Program in Petroleum Geology of ITB. The oil and gas industry is a global scale industry, with areas of operations worldwide both onshore and offshore. The world community realizes that in the future it will be very hard to be able to meet the world oil and gas needs because of its unrenewable nature.

The role of oil and natural gas is very important, among others: generating foreign exchange, domestic energy providers, suppliers of industrial raw materials, technology transfer vehicles, job creation, encouraging the development of non-oil and gas sector and supporting regional development.

Oil and gas business activities not only provide benefits from the economic and income sectors of society, but also cause various problems that are commonly encountered such as business licensing, space utilization conflict, social conflict with local communities, environmental problems resulting from waste and excesses of activities undertaken as well public health problems around the activity site.

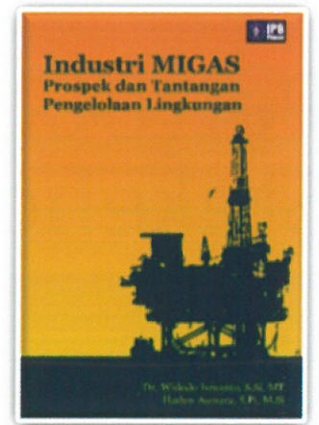
The operation of exploitation activities in order to find and increase oil and gas reserves is not always considering the ecological effect. Oil spills, land damage, land accidents, fires and accidents in the air and water pollution have all been recorded by time and place. At the present time the social impacts of oil and gas operations on communities that inhabit the area around the entry activities in the planning that must be considered.

The oil and gas industry has been working for a long time to align the challenge of creating environmental protection. Most have achieved what is desired, but it must be admitted that there are some that have not been as expected.

This book provides guidance for discussing environmental issues within the oil and gas exploration and production industry. Another guide is to provide the most appropriate way to achieve high environmental performance across sectors, in addition to storage and transport issues or downstream processing. Strategic management issues are described within the framework of work rules and company approaches to environmental management, while the operational aspects are addressed in environmental protection measures. To make it easier to know the contents of this book then do the discussion separately that is about the operation, the potential impact and measurement control.

In this book discussed about the environmental management of the oil and gas industry that contains the background of strategic aspects in environmental management. Some international and national regulations within the framework of existing infrastructure are a requirement in environmental protection rules. The applied approach to environmental management in the oil and gas industry has been set forth with guidance on the development and application of the



Health, Safety and Environment Management System (HSE-MS). The industry has a strong commitment to the integration of HSE-MS and recognizes the existence of international standards for system models, including the International standards Organization ISO 9000 for quality management, and ISO 14000 for environmental management. This book also reviews the implementation of AMDAL (Environmental Impact Analysis) in oil and gas business as well as a review of the quality of AMDAL documents on seven oil and gas companies namely PT.CPI Lapangan Duri, Pertamina UP III Plaju, PT.Lapindo Brantas, KKKS Suryaraya Teladan Pendopo, BP Tangguh, Expan Blok Toili and KKKS Hess Pangkah.

This book is useful for Government and related agencies to promote a solid understanding of the exploration and operation of oil and gas production and how it affects the environment. Such activities should be appropriate to be complementary in order to achieve cost effectiveness and environmental approaches.

For practitioners and students, this book provides a detailed explanation of the instructions for running the operation technique and its elements to be done in the field. This is very important as a reference to consider the implementation of environmental prevention measures including environmental audits set by the International Chamber of Commerce (ICC) aims to help protect the environment by looking at a systematic, documented, periodically objective management tool of an organization environment interm of management and equipment performance.

A Guide to Wash Your Hand Properly

Benefit of hand washing are reduces the number of people who get sick with diarrhea by 31%, Reduces diarrheal illness in people with weakened immune systems by 58%, Reduces respiratory illnesses, like colds, in the general population by 21%. Hand washing is one of the best ways to avoid getting sick and spreading illness to others. Sick employees are less productive even when they come to work. They may also spread illness to others at work.

Despite widespread knowledge of the importance of hand washing, there is still room for improvement. A recent study showed that only 31% of men and 65% of women washed their hands after using a public restroom.

There are five common hand washing mistakes in the workplace

1. **Skipping Drying.** Hand washing is a 5-Step process: Wet, Lather, Scrub, Rinse, Dry. The final step is just as important as the first few, and if you catch yourself wiping your still-wet hands on your jeans after exiting the restroom, you're setting up a cozy environment for bathroom bacteria. The Mayo Foundation for Medical Education and Research reports that bacteria spreads more easily to and from wet hands. They note that paper towels are hygienically superior to air-dryers, since air-dryers have been found to spread bacteria from three to six feet from the device.
2. **Sanitizing Instead of Washing.** Keeping a bottle of at least 60% alcohol hand sanitizer at your desk is always a good idea, but a pump of hand sanitizer is no substitution for the real deal. According to the CDC, hand sanitizers might not eliminate all types of germs or be able to remove some harmful chemicals. Soap and water is the best way to fight germs.
3. **Taking Shortcuts.** How long do you usually scrub for? The CDC recommends scrubbing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds (about the same time it takes to hum the "Happy Birthday" song twice through. Don't forget to scrub the tops of your hands, between your fingers, and under your nails!
4. **Timing and Touch.** Have you ever closed the bathroom stall behind you, fixed your hair, scratched behind your ear, and then approached to sink to wash your hands? Think twice before touching your hair or face after using the restroom—this is a quick way for bacteria to spread and hurt you. Head straight to the sink after working!
5. **Infrequent Washing.** It's ingrained in most of us to wash after using the restroom, but it's also important to thoroughly wash your hands after handling garbage, touching public surfaces, touching animals, blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.

Hand washing is an easy, inexpensive, and effective way to prevent the spread of germs and keep employees healthy. Hand washing gives people the opportunity to take an active role in their own health. Most hand washing studies have focused on child care or health care settings. The few that have looked at corporate settings show that promoting clean hands results in fewer employee sick days

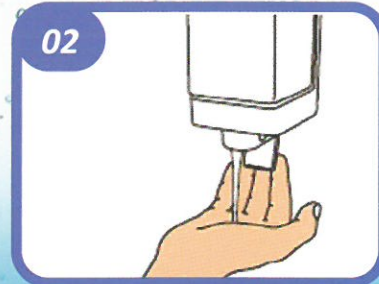
